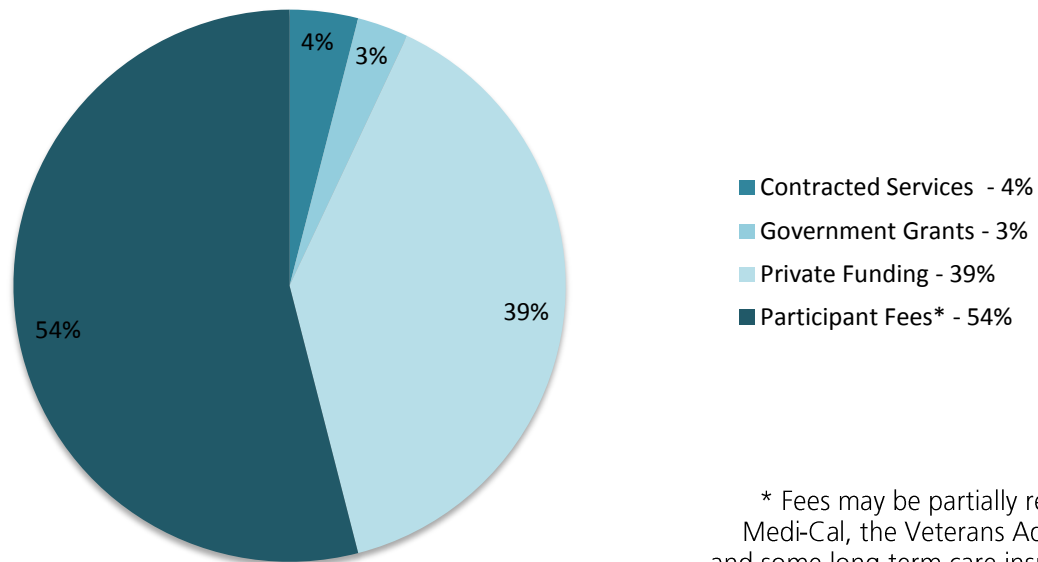


# How We Are Funded

Alzheimer's Family Services Center Funding Sources



\* Fees may be partially reimbursed by Medi-Cal, the Veterans Administration, and some long-term care insurance plans.



Alzheimer's Family Services Center (AFSC) represents an affordable alternative for families unable to pay the high cost of in-home or full-time care. While AFSC spends \$121 per participant per day to provide dementia-specific adult day health care, our stated daily rate is \$95, and we receive an average of only \$83 per day across all payment streams. In order to maintain our high quality services, we must fundraise to make up the difference.

AFSC has instituted multiple fund development strategies, including: (1) an annual gala, *A Gathering of Friends*, (3) an online giving strategy to reach new donors through email solicitations and the Internet, (4) year-round major giving and planned giving programs, (5) extensive grant-seeking from foundations, corporations, and government sources, and (6) grassroots efforts such as rummage sales led by volunteers. In order to help ensure that critical dementia-specific adult day health care, support and education services are available to those who need it most, AFSC is committed to raising approximately \$1.4 million in charitable income this fiscal year.

As the graph above indicates, AFSC relies heavily on private donations as less than 3% of the agency's total annual budget is funded through government sources.
